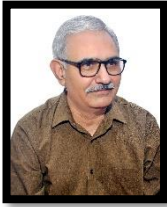
THE TORCH BEARER

(25th September, 1914 – 6th April 2001)

Chaudhary Devi Lal University, Sirsa is named after Jan Nayak Chaudhary Devi Lal, the former Deputy Prime Minister of India and the former Chief Minister of Haryana.

Ch. Devi Lal was a veteran freedom fighter, a crusader against the British Raj and a symbol of patience and fortitude. He proved himself to be a man of action, be it in the freedom movement or the post-independence amelioration of the plight of the suffering peasantry. He was looked upon with love and affection during his younger days and with reverential awe in his later life, when he was popularly nicknamed “Tau”. The welfare of the people was a mission with Chaudhary Devi Lal, who strove hard to see the peoples’ power reflected in the peoples’ rule. He was committed to the development of the backward classes, which included farmers, the oppressed and women. He always wanted the present education system to impart true knowledge. UNIVERSITY AT A GLANCE

Established on 2nd April, 2003, CDLU, Sirsa is named after Jan Nayak Chaudhary Devi Lal, the former Deputy Prime Minister of India and the former Chief Minister of Haryana. This University, set up by the Government of Haryana under Act 9 of 2003 passed by the State Legislature, has a sprawling campus of 213 Acre, 4 Kanal, 12 Marla at Barnala Road, Sirsa.

The university has four Teaching Blocks, well-equipped labs, Vivekananda Library, five well-furnished hostels for boys and girls, Media Centre with a Community Radio Station, a majestic Multi Purpose Hall and auditorium, Shopping complex, University Health Centre and the branch of a nationalized bank, Guest House, Vice Chancellor's residence and 144 houses for the teaching and non-teaching staff. Fourth teaching block is near completion, besides extension of other buildings.

The main objective of the University is to facilitate, promote and excel in Higher Education, Research and Consultancy in the conventional as well as emerging areas of knowledge. To enhance the standard of higher education and increase the research activities the University has been connected to National Knowledge Network (NKN) provided through one GBPS (optical fiber) dedicated line under NMEICT project of Ministry of HRD India. Wi-Fi facility has also been provided in the University campus. During the lock down and in the post lock down period the university has adopted online mode of teaching. The process of admission is also online and to ensure the health hazards of the prospective students, the admission process has been simplified and it is expected that the students will be self-accountable in furnishing the relevant information and will enter into academic programmes in full earnestness and with integrity for self- enrichment.

The university at present has (approx.) **61** colleges affiliated to it. The total enrollment of students in UTDs, University College and Affiliated Colleges crosses 42000.

24 Teaching Departments, USGS and University College in the University offers 53 academic programmes under budgeted mode and Self Financing System in the area of Technology, Management, Commerce, Law, Journalism and Mass Communication, Humanities, Social Sciences, Science and Education. CHAPTER-I

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO M.Ed., TWO YEAR PROGRAMME IN AFFILIATED COLLEGES

Eligibility: Master of Education (M.Ed.) two year programme :

B.Ed. or B.A.-B.Ed. or B.Sc.-B.Ed. or B.El. Ed. or D.El. Ed. with an undergraduate degree (with 50% marks in each) or an examination recognized as equivalent to B.Ed. with not less than 50% marks in aggregate.

Relaxation in eligibility condition:

Relaxation in minimum eligibility condition will be given to SC/ST of Haryana State and Persons with disabilities of all India candidates as per University rule.

Note: There shall be no rounding off of percentage of marks of the qualifying examination from 0.5% and above to next higher number for determining the eligibility i.e. 49.5% and above will not be rounded off to 50%.

CHAPTER-II

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE CANDIDATES

1. Last date to apply online Application Form for admission to M.Ed. (two year) is 22.12.2022.
2. The candidates will submit their choice of college(s) preference wise as per the instructions made available by the UTIDC on the online application portal.
3. Before filling the Admission Form the candidates are required to read the HBI carefully.
4. Candidates having compartment in the qualifying examination shall not be allowed admission even provisionally.
5. Candidates will be allowed to participate in counselling only if his/her result of qualifying examination is declared by the concerned University upto the time of counselling atleast one day prior to the day of respective counselling.
6. No inter-college migration or transfer will be allowed.
7. The admission to M.Ed. (two year) Programme will be made strictly on the basis of merit of qualifying examination and no other weightage will be given. In case two or more candidates in the merit list have equal marks, the candidate senior in age will be considered first.
8. At the time of admission, every candidate shall be required to give an undertaking of good conduct & behaviour and non-indulgence in ragging. If a candidate, after his/her admission, is found indulging in any kind of ragging, his/her admission is liable to be cancelled and the fee deposited will be forfeited. Each admitted student shall have to furnish two undertakings (as per specimen given in the HBI) from himself/herself and his/her parent/guardian that he/she was never found guilty of ragging and shall not indulge in any act of ragging.
9. Weekly attendance report of all students will be put on the College Website. If a student remains absent from the class for 14 days or more in a month his name will be struck off from the rolls and his/her parents will also be informed. If a student fails to attend his/her classes continuously for seven days from the date of commencement of the classes or from the date of admission, his/her admission shall be cancelled and the fee deposited will be forfeited.
10. Any legal dispute relating to admission of students will be subject to Courts at Sirsa or Courts having jurisdiction in Sirsa.
11. If, at any stage, it is found that the candidate has supplied any incomplete or false or incorrect information in the application form, his/her candidature for the programme shall be cancelled and he/she shall be liable for disciplinary action as per the University rules and the fee deposited will be forfeited.
12. A Candidate who has passed qualifying examination from any University of Haryana state will be considered as Haryana resident and he/she is not required to submit Haryana Resident Certificate. Other candidates for seeking benefit of Haryana resident, should submit a certificate of Bonafide Resident of Haryana as per guidelines at Annexure.
13. An official E-mail ID will be allotted and communicated to every regular student by the concerned Institute for sending official communication to him/her.
14. As per NCTE norms 80% attendance for classes and 90% attendance for field are compulsory for the students.

CHAPTER-III

PROCEDURE FOR PREPARING MERIT

Admission to M.Ed. (two year) programme will be made strictly on the basis of merit in qualifying examinations and no other weightage will be given.

NOTE:

- In case two or more candidates in merit list have equal mark in qualifying examinations, the candidate senior in age will be considered first.
- The candidates are advised to bring original and also one set of attested photocopies of all the documents and testimonials at the time of counseling for verification of their original documents. No excuse what so ever shall be entertained for non-production of original documents.

CHAPTER-IV

DISTRIBUTION AND RESERVATION OF SEATS/EWS

Note: If seats will remain vacant in Haryana open category, the same may be converted into All India category at the time of physical counselling.

CHAPTER –V

FEES

The selected candidates for admission to M.Ed. (two year) Programme ,will deposit the fees on the day of counselling for the full programme as under:

(A) Fee for affiliated colleges of Education running M.Ed. (two Year) Programme under Self-Financing Scheme.

2. For 2nd year the fee will be same excluding other charges.

CHAPTER-VI
MANDATORY CONDITIONS

1. Nothing contained in this HBI should be construed to convey sanction or cited as an authority for which University regulations in Calendars Vol. I, II and the relevant rules in Calendar Vol. III alone are applicable.
2. If the concerned authorities are not satisfied with the character, past behaviour and antecedents of a candidate, they may refuse to admit him/her to M.Ed. (two year) Programme in the colleges in order to ensure academic standards, discipline and peaceful atmosphere in the university/college. The Vice-Chancellor may cancel the admission of any student for a specified period.
3. In case of any ambiguity the interpretation given by the Vice Chancellor shall be final.

NOTE: THE CANDIDATES ARE REQUIRED TO BRING THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS AT THE TIME OF COUNSELING.

1. CHARACTER CERTIFICATE

Character Certificate is essential for Admission. The detail of Character Certificate to furnish shall be as under:

(a) Private candidates:

Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination as private candidates should submit their character certificate duly signed by a First Class Magistrate/Sarpanch /MC/Notary Public.

(b) Gaps in study:

Candidates who have gaps in their academic career after the qualifying exam intake, must furnish a gap certificate, in the form of affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper or certificate from the employer (if in service) and should also furnish separately the character certificate of gap period duly attested by Notary Public.

(c) Candidates who have recently qualified:

Candidates who have recently passed/appeared the qualifying examination in 2021 must submit Character Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended as per specimen given in **Annexure-II**.

2. OTHER CERTIFICATES

- (a) Certificate of qualifying examination passed.
- (b) Matriculation or equivalent examination certificate in support of date of birth; and +2 certificates.
- (c) Certificate on the form prescribed in the Prospectus for candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes of Haryana.
- (d) Resident certificate in the case of candidates claiming to be bonafide resident of Haryana.
- (e) Employer's Certificate in case of employee.

CHAPTER – VII
ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE

The eligibility for admission to M.Ed.(two year) will be checked by the Admission Committee of the concerned college. All admissions will be provisional till the Registration Branch will check all documents of admitted candidates.

Benefits of fee for SC Candidates of Haryana

The Post Matric Scholarship Scheme of GOI, SC students whose parents/guardian income is less than Rs.3 lac are eligible for benefits under the scheme. The benefits include enrollments/registration, tuition, games, Union, Library, Magazine, Medical Examination and such other fees compulsory payable by the student to the institution or University/Board. Refundable deposit like caution money, security deposit will, however, be excluded.

NOTE : An income declaration will be furnished by the self-employed parents/guardians of SC candidates, stating definite income from all sources by way of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper. Employed parents/guardians are required to obtain income certificates from their employer and for any additional income from other sources, they would furnish declaration by way of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper.

CHAPTER-VIII
MIGRATION RULES

No Migration is allowed from one college to another.

A student from any other recognized University shall be eligible for admission to the University only on production of the migration certificate (or transfer certificate if a Board does not issue the migration certificate) to show that the University or the Board has no objection to his/her joining this University and he/she will have to submit the same upto **31.03.2023** without any late fee, failing which his/her candidature for the concerned examination shall stand suspended automatically, provided that the condition of production of the migration certificate shall not apply in the case of students passing their examination from foreign University.

The migration certificate will be accepted through the principal of concerned affiliated College on payment of late fees mentioned below:

With late fee of Rs.500/-	:	upto 30.04.2023
With late fee of Rs.1000/-	:	upto 31.05.2023
With late fee of Rs.2000/-	:	till the declaration of result
With late fee of Rs.2500/-	:	after the declaration of result per year (upto Rs. 5000/-)

NOTE: The word 'examination' in the above rules denotes the first 'Annual examination'.

CHAPTER -IX

INTERPRETATION OF RULES & REGULATIONS:

THE REMEDIES PROVIDED IN RESPECT OF ADMISSION POLICY

In the event of any inconsistency amongst the rules framed for admission etc. or in the event of any clarification with respect to the above said rules, the matter shall be referred to the Vice-Chancellor and the interpretation given by the Vice-Chancellor shall be final. The Vice-Chancellor is also competent to eliminate any inconsistency and to decide as to which provision shall take precedence over the other.

Remedies:

If any applicant or any other person is of the opinion that in his/her case, the rules framed for admission etc. have not been followed, he/she shall make an application outlining clearly the deviation in his/her opinion to the Vice-Chancellor. The Vice-Chancellor shall consider the application in the light of relevant rules and his decision in the matter shall be final.

Public Notice on Fake Universities

The University Grants Commission Act, 1956: under Section 22 stipulated that:

"(1) The right of conferring or granting degrees shall be exercised only by a University established or incorporated by or under a Central Act, a Provincial Act or a State Act or an institution deemed to be a University under Section 3 or an institution specially empowered by an Act of Parliament to confer or grant degrees.

(2) Save as provided in sub-Section (1), no person or authority shall confer, or grant, or hold himself or itself out as entitled to confer or grant, any degree.....,

Further, Section 23 of the UGC Act prohibits the use of the word 'University' by any institution other than a university established as stated above.

Students and Public at large are hereby informed that presently following 21 self-styled, unrecognized institutions which are functioning in contravention of the UGC Act, have been declared as fake universities and these are not empowered to confer any degree.

Copy of letter No. 62/17/95-6 GSI dated Oct., 1966 from the Chief Secretary to Government of Haryana addressed to all Heads of Departments, Commissioner/ Ambala, Rohtak, Gurgaon and Hisar Division etc.

Subject: Bona fide Residents of Haryana – Guidelines regarding

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Govt. letter on the subject noted above vide which the instruction were issued regarding simplification of procedure for obtaining the certificate of Domicile for the purpose of admission to educational institutions (including technical/medical institutions). The matter has been reconsidered in the light of judgment delivered by the Hon 'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Dr. Pradeep Jain vs. Union of India and other reported as AIR 1984.SC.1421, where in it has been held that instead of the word 'Domicile' the word 'Resident' be used in the instructions. Henceforth the following categories of persons would be eligible for the grant of Resident certificate:

- a. Candidates who have passes the examinations qualifying them for selection in an institution from a school/college in Haryana.
- b. Children/wards (if parents are not living) Dependent:
 - i. of the regular employees of Haryana State Posted in/outside Haryana State or working on deputation.
 - ii. of the regular employees of the statutory bodies/corporations established by or under an Act of the State of Haryana who are posted in Chandigarh or in /outside Haryana;
 - iii. of the regular employees of the Government of India posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of the Haryana Government.
- c. Children/wards (if parents not living) dependents of persons who after retirement have permanently settled in Haryana and draw their pension from the treasuries situated in the State of Haryana.
- d. Children/Wards (if parents not living)/ dependents of pensioners of Haryana Government irrespective of the fact that the original home of the retiree is in a State other than Haryana or he has settled after retirement in or out side Haryana.
- e. Children/Wards (if parents not living)/dependents of persons who have permanently home in the Haryana and include persons who have been residing in Haryana for a period of less than 15 years or who have permanent home in Haryana but on account of their occupation they are living out side Haryana
- f. The wives of such persons who are bona fide resident of Haryana irrespective of the fact that they had belonged to any other State before marriage.

- g. Persons who were born in Haryana and produce a certificate to that effect; provided that the parents/Guardians (if parents are not living) of persons belonging to any one of the above mentioned categories are:
- i. Citizen of India;
 - ii. Produce an affidavit to the effect they or their children/ wards (if parents are not living)/dependents have not obtained the benefit of Resident in any other State.
2. All candidates claiming to be Bona fide residents of Haryana should produce a Haryana Resident Certificate signed by the District Magistrate / General Assistant of Deputy Commissioner of Sub-Divisional Officer (Civil) of the District/Sub-divisional to which the candidates belong. Residents Certificate in respect of elsewhere or in respect of the Children/Wards/dependents of Haryana Govt. Employee who are posted at Chandigarh, Delhi or elsewhere in respect Haryana in connection with affairs of Haryana Govt. or in respect of Children/Wards/dependents of the employees and retirees of the Statutory bodies/ Corporations of Haryana established by or under an Act of the State of Haryana or Central Act and located at Chandigarh, Haryana and outside Haryana, should be issued by their respective heads of Departments.
3. Candidates seeking admission in the Educational Institutions (including medical and technical institutions) located in Haryana may not be required to produce resident certificate, if they have passed the Examination from a School/College situated in Haryana. For this purpose a certificate of the Principal/Headmaster of the Institution shall, be competent to issue such certificate, which should be sufficient.
4. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of claim that he belongs to the State of Haryana but at any subsequent time is discovered that his claim is false, the student shall be removed from the institution, all fees and other dues paid up to the date of such removal shall be confiscated. The Principal may take such other action against the students and his /her parents/ Guardians as he may deem proper in the circumstances of any particular case.
