Following issues were discussed and resolved:

- a) The Board appreciated the efforts made by the Common Syllabi Committee towards framing of common syllabi for B.A. English Compulsory paper.
- b) The Board unanimously resolved to adopt the syllabus and the text book of B.A.I (First Semester) as approved by the Common Syllabi Committee in its meeting held on 25.01.14 at Department of English and Foreign languages M.D U Rohtak. The revised syllabus and scheme of examination shall be introduced in B.A semester I w. e. f. 2014-15.
- c) The details of syllabus and scheme of examination is as under:

The name of the book – Literature and Language I: Editors: Loveleen Mohan, Randeep Rana and Jaibir Singh Hooda. Publishers: Orient Blackswan

Workload: 8 periods of 45 (45X8= 360 min) minutes per week for Text:
2 periods of 45 minutes per week for composition for a group of 20 students per group

Instructions to the Paper Setter and the Students:

Note: All questions are compulsory. Marks have been indicated after each question.

Q 1. This question will be based on phonetic transcription given in the chapters in the text book. The students shall transcribe eight words out of the given twelve. (08)

Q 2. This question will be short answer type based on the chapters in the text book. The students shall answer any five out of the given eight short questions (in about 30 words each). (10)

Q 3. This question will be inference based, intended to elicit the understanding of the text by the students. The students shall answer any five out of the given eight questions based on the chapters (in about 75-100 words each). (20)

Q 4. This question will be based on a comprehension passage from the text followed by four questions. (08)

Q 5. This question will be based on vocabulary from the exercises following the chapters. The students shall attempt questions on vocabulary (Number, Synonyms, Antonyms, One Word Substitution etc.). The students shall answer any 10 out of the given 15 words. (10)

Q 6. This question will be based on grammar from the text book.

a) This question will be based on the use of tenses. The students shall attempt 8 out of 12 questions. (08)

b) This question will be based on translation from Hindi into English. The students shall translate 8 out of 12 sentences. (08)

Note: Questions will be based on the exercises but not from the exercises as such.

Q 7. The students shall write one paragraph (in about 150-200 words) on any one of the four topics given. (08)

2. The Board also made the following suggestions to be placed before the Common Syllabi Committee:-

- i) Translation component should be included in the syllabus and scheme of examination of the remaining semesters of B.A English compulsory paper.
- ii) The outline of syllabi for remaining semesters of B.A. English compulsory be finalized in advance.
- iii) The component of phonetic transcription should be made an integral part of the syllabi in all the semesters.

Q.No.4 (a) Grammar: This question will be based on the grammar exercises given in the text book. The sentences will not necessarily be the same as given in exercises. Students will be required to attempt any twenty sentences out of the given twenty-five.

(b) Do as directed (Articles, Prepositions, & Conjunctions). Students will be required to attempt any seven out of the given ten.

(b) Students will be required to transcribe and mark primary stress on any ten words out of the given fifteen words. (For blind candidates only). There will be a question based on vocabulary. (Words may ~~fifteen~~ not be the same as given in the exercise. 10 Marks

(c) Vocabulary exercise (any ten out of the given fifteen). 10 Marks

Q.No.5 Translation:

(a) Students will be required to translation one short unseen passage from Hindi into English. 5 marks

(b) Students will be required to translate one short unseen passage from English to Hindi. 5 marks
